


Mourning the passing of His Excellency Bishop Williamson

The Order of the Knights of Our Lady mourns the passing of His Excellency Bishop Richard N. Williamson, a steadfast guardian of the traditional Catholic Faith in the wake of Archbishop Lefebvre, who consecrated him with three of his confrères on 30 June 1988. He was the one who chose “Fidelis inveniatur” as his motto, and these two words may well sum up all of his episcopal course, while so many have kept changing their orientation.


Contrary to the many instances of calumny and misrepresentation about him by those who portrayed him as an “extremist,” he has always been extremely charitable and open, while, of course, still calling a spade a spade, holding fast to the teaching of seasoned missionary of the Catholic Faith Archbishop Lefebvre, who refused “to follow the Rome of neo-Modernist and neo-Protestant tendencies” (1974 Declaration) and considered the sacraments given by Conciliar bishops as all “doubtful.” (1976 Lille homily, 1988 Episcopal consecrations), which is why Bishop Williamson would, not only ordain priests or consecrate



bishops to keep the Faith and grace alive, but also occasionally re-ordain conditionally a priest or a bishop.
